<b>ITEM TITLE</b>	Tax credit request of \$4000 for SANITY
<b>DISCUSSION NOTES</b>	<p>Presentation by Tobias Kockenderfer SANITY is a program designed to get students interested in careers in science with hopes of them going into either higher education or directly into the field. It's at the American Museum of Natural History Southwestern Research Station in the Chiricahua Mountain range. It has been going on for about 20 years. Ms. Isabella Constantine and Mr. Tobias Kockenderfer have now taken over the program at Tucson High. Provides authentic field experience in science and collecting data. Want to fund 16 students with food and board. There are also transportation costs. Per student cost is \$246.58. The request of \$4000 would mean students would not have to pay to participate. Since the original request paperwork was completed, we have done some fundraising and could accept a lower amount. We have increased our tax credit account and established a club through Student Council. This will allow us to get going and make the program run again. We can fundraise and be more self-sustaining. The club also allows us to include students outside of biotechnology classes.</p> <p>General discussion of funds and benefits. NS proposed funding at the original requested amount to make sure students are able to participate at 0 cost and the club is able to maintain some basic operating funds? Motion to accept proposal JF with second NS. Unanimous approval.</p>
